Children and Young People

The course gives you 60 hours of face-to-face training and will provide you with the tools and knowledge that will help you feel prepared to work ethically with this client group.

This course will consider the following areas of working:

Module 1: Applying Theory to practice: This module investigates theory in relation to working with Children and Young People, providing information on theories of development along with counselling theory.

Module 2: Developing reflective practice: This module will allow the participants to improve their reflective skills and acknowledge the unique reflections that are required when working with client groups that are vulnerable and have additional requirements.

Module 3: Ethics and Young People: This module will allow development of ethical understanding and risk assessments

Module 4: Working Creatively: To ensure that the learning is more than theoretical this module will develop the participant's practical skills as children and young people's counsellor.

Module 5: Loss and Attachment: This module will allow application of theory explored in module 1 in relation to client work especially focused on the environment that this client group are influenced by

Module 6: Research proposal: this module will build on your understanding of research that you have already undertaken in previous levels and allow you to develop this understanding in relation to a particular area of working with children and young people that you are interested in

The cost of the course is £970 (payment terms are available upon request).

Please note that a minimum of 4 persons are required for these courses to run







Supervision

The course is run over 20 weeks, with study breaks each term, giving you a total of 60 hours of face-to-face training.

Unlike other supervision training this course is designed to provide a depth to your knowledge that includes not only more than 3 theoretical models of supervision but also reflective practice

and ethics, along with the opportunity to further investigate an area of counselling and supervision that really interests you.

The modules studied will be – Understanding theory and frameworks of supervision, applying theory to practice, research methodologies and reflective approach to being a supervisor.

The assessments include:

- Supervision log of at least 10 supervision sessions
- Reflective Journals
- 3, 000-word reflective essay on the application of theory to own practice
- Practicum of 20-minute supervision session observed by peers and tutor
- Research project
